




About Us

Gibson's Edmonton Terminal is a 24 hour, 7 day operation with full shift operations and maintenance department employing more than 60 people locally with approximately 1.7 million barrels of storage. Our Edmonton Terminal is fully connected to 'pipeline alley', one of the most significant energy transportation hubs in Canada. Fully connected to multiple inbound and outbound pipelines, our facility can also offer customers unparalleled flexibility in getting crude oil, liquids and refined product to market through our connection to major rail lines and truck unloading and loading capabilities.



Rail and Road Connectivity

In addition to storage capacity, our Edmonton facility offers customers the most flexible offloading and loading infrastructure in the industry, along with receipt and delivery options, using a combination of truck, rail and pipe, to ensure product gets to market safely and reliably. Our Edmonton rail facility connects to both CP and CN rail lines. Currently, our Edmonton Terminal has capacity for loading and offloading up to 85 railcars.



Biofuels Blending

In 2022, Gibson completed the Biofuels Blending Project which involved an expansion of infrastructure to facilitate the storage, blending and transportation of lower-emission renewable diesel. The Biofuels Blending Project demonstrates how our asset base can help support the energy transition and the changing needs of our customers.
