


Hardisty Operations

Gibson Energy (Gibson) is a Canadian-based liquids infrastructure company with its principal businesses consisting of the storage, optimization, processing, and gathering of liquids and refined products. Headquartered in Calgary, Alberta, Gibson's operations are focused around its core terminal assets located at Hardisty and Edmonton, Alberta, and include the Moose Jaw Facility and an infrastructure position in the U.S.

Terminal Storage

Gibson's Hardisty Terminal is a 24 hour, 7 day operation with full shift operations and maintenance department employing more than 100 people locally. Our Hardisty Terminal is strategically located in the heart of the most important heavy crude oil storage hub in Canada, with approximately 14.0 million barrels of existing storage. As the largest independent storage facility at Hardisty, and with the best-in-class connectivity to inbound and outbound pipelines, our Hardisty Terminal offers the most flexibility to our customers as they transport their products to end markets. We touch one in four barrels of crude oil produced in Western Canada.



Rail and Road Connectivity

Gibson's Hardisty Terminal also has exclusive access to the Hardisty Unit Rail Facility, a Joint Venture with USD Group, which has the ability to load up to three-unit trains per day, moving approximately 210,000 barrels per day. Our customers at the terminal include supermajors, senior oil sands producers, refiners and others. With significant acreage adjacent to the existing tanks and in the surrounding area, we plan to continue growing our position at Hardisty.
